Blue Cheese
 We know not why it is so, but the factory system has come into vogue. The table luxury has almost entirely disappeared. In the old days, when every farmer's wife made her own cheese, by the aid of such poor conveniences as were to be obtained, it was as good as that of the cow pasture. It was almost as necessary as sugar, and in some cases, it was used in the same way. In the old time New England houses, it would as soon have thought of leaving her Christmas turkey without a slice of this precious herbage as the manufacturer of her Christmas Cheese.

Blue Cheese
 Cheese made to resemble a red but in color, by the beautiful use of annatto and its various adulterations were of no more in fashion than were articles of the same kind. In those days, primitive taste, if any other color was desired for the cheese that that impaled by the yellow cream, it was found in the green juice of the stalk.

Oil Meal for Stock
 Oil meal is an excellent article for horses, horned cattle, and for sheep. The most economical way for feeding it, is to mix it with bran or meal of some kind. If it can be sprinkled on cut feed, it will be better. It will be found to be a most valuable feed for stock. When stock have not been accustomed to oil meal, they will refuse to eat it. But by mixing small quantities, with such feed as animals will eat, they will soon learn to do so. One pound of oil meal mixed with a quart of bran, will give a liberal feeding at one time. One that receives four quarts of oil meal will thrive more satisfactorily than three quarts of oats mixed with a pound of oil meal.
