How a PRACTICAL DAIRYMAN Feeds His Cows—A correspondent of the Cincinnati Gazette, who has had much experience in the management of a dairy, writes the following account of the manner in which he feeds his cows, which will undoubtedly be of great interest to farmers:

I feed a dairy of 208 cows. At 5 o'clock in the morning and at five o'clock in the evening, I chop feed (a mixture of clover and timothy) in a car box and feed long, three feet wide and three feet deep, two barrels of meal (ground) and like it very much after being fed. I also feed four barrels of bran and four barrels of small manufacturers are added. The whole is now mixed together by shoveling and then cut corn, fed in a car box. It is put in and mixed with the other feed to make the car box three-fourths full. The morning feed is prepared the evening previous.

At eight o'clock hay is fed, closer preferred in small lots, and during the winter the cows have eaten all they want.

At 12 o'clock a car box full of slop is fed, made as follows: One hundred pounds of middlings, sixty pounds of oil cake meal, and thirty or forty scoopsful of brewers' grain is mixed up with plenty of hot water. This is done at 10 o'clock, and at 12 o'clock four bushels of barley sprouts are added and enough cold water to make it the right temperature to feed.

Of this slop the cows are fed as much as they will eat. Some eat less than two bucketsful. None eat four bucketsful. This slop is all the drink they get.

I raise my corn fodder by sowing seed corn broadcast, pretty thick on good ground. It often turns out ten tons to the acre in the two crops which can be raised each year. I have raised a crop of corn and would like it for my winter fodder, also, were it not so difficult to cure.

My cows when kept in the stable, have no bedding. They are carried and cleaned twice a week.

I have been in the business of feeding dairy cows for more than a quarter of a century, and I have never had a cow do better than mine are doing now.

How Good Farmers Save Money—They take good papers and read them.

They keep accounts of their farm operations.
