WAR IN EUROPE

THE EUROPEAN NON-COMBATANTS.

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 22.—The news that the Turkish reserves had isolated herself is officially denied.

PARIS, July 22.—It is reported today that Switzerland has asked permission to occupy the Rhine, the most northern province of Savoy, on the Lake of Geneva, claiming by the treaty of Vienna it has a right to do so.

RUSSIA WILL FIGHT IF NECESSARY.

St. Petersburg, July 24.—Evening.—In today's issue of an official journal of the Empire, published in this city, the attitude of Russia toward the combatants in the Franco-Prussian contest is fully explained.

The journal says "Russia will exert every effort to prevent a war in which she herself might possibly become involved."

The Emperor has resolved to remain neutral unless the interests of Russia shall become endangered by the contingencies of war.

AUSTRIA TO REMAIN NEUTRAL.

Vienna, July 24.—Boron Heintz, the Austrian Minister, has issued a circular to the Austrian Ministers abroad. He says:

If unsuccessful in sparing Europe bloodshed and Austria the most serious consequences inseparable to a war between two powerful nations, we desire, at least to limit the violence of the struggle.

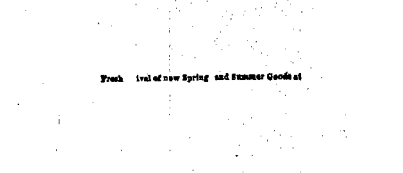
