

After Mowing.
The words have been said to the boys, that were faithful at this time, the hay is harvested and they want to go fishing, or to the beach, or to a picnic, or fair. All these let them go and have a good time and let your business go with them. If you do not go yourself, then you promised yourself if there ever came another dry time, you would get at least a hundred cords of part cut of the pond here, that is not more than one month in the year. Now that the promise is fulfilled to the letter. You can no more afford to cheat yourself out of a good thing than the boys. You have done using the rope, the mower, the horse-rake, and treader. Do not let them lie around in the field or under the shed, but put these articles in the loft where they will remain until next season. Put them up and oil them, ready for use to-morrow. Then top-dressing your meadows and your pastures is in order. And the sooner you put on the compost after laying the better it will be for the roots of the grasses. If you are doubtful about this matter take a dozen loads out of your barnyard and try it upon an acre of run-down meadow. You will make a new meadow and be converted. Then wash your top-dress or not, carefully guard your alfalfa against all cropping. To crop does not pay.

Selecting Seed Corn.
The progressive and progressive farmer considers the selection of his corn for the following years' growing an important matter. He will go through his field day by day, when the corn is green to select the largest, earliest and most perfect ears for seed. This seed should be pulled with the hands, or carried to the barn, and then allowed to lie for two or three days with the husks on; when the ear is stripped of its covering, leave sufficient husks to be tied or banded into a string of ears so that they can be hung up. In this work of preparing to put away for seed, let the farmer again select the best ears with the smallest cobs and reject all others. Save double the amount you will probably need, as the best planting may rot in the earth, or be destroyed by the cut worm, or be cut off by some insect pest. As corn seems to be a crop that American people will grow, whether more profitable than others or not, there is a subject concerning it, and good and profitable that should receive the careful attention of farmers, than that of having early maturing, improved seed-corn saved early and well cared for. The earlier the corn for seed is selected, after the process of induration, the better; the drier your seed is kept until wanted for planting, the better it will grow. — [T. in Chicago's Rural World.]

GRAHAM MEAL — Faith Rochester says: Does anybody want to know how to make Graham meal? There are people who raise the best of wheat, year after year, and live on fine flour always, and have no idea how sweet, as well as healthy, the unbleached or Graham flour is. It is the best of wheat, you can make a basty pudding, mixing the meal with your hand slowly into boiling water, stirring briskly meanwhile. A few minutes' boiling makes it cook. It is sufficiently though many look it longer. Sweetened cream is an excellent dressing for it, and then if you add fresh berries — well, just try it. Many persons like it with sweetened cream or milk as they eat bread-stuff. Wheaten grits are usually bought in paper parcels with directions for cooking.
