ALFRED CORRESPONDENCE. ALFRED, Oct. 3, 1870.

One of the most sad and melancholy accidents which has occurred in our vicinity, took place on Tuesday eve of last week.

In the afternoon Luther Lewis, the adopted son of Dan Lyman H. Lewis, went on an orchard about one-half mile from home, for the purpose of gathering apples.

After he got home, he and Mr. Lewis went to the village and had his shoulder set by Dr. E. C. Green, when they returned home, it being nearly dark.

Mr. Lewis went alone to the orchard for the purpose of getting the team and wagon home, as they used them to carry milk to the Cheese Factory every morning.

He was gone so long from the house that they became alarmed, and Luther went about 8 o'clock in the evening to find him.

The injury consisted of a cut on the forehead, directly above the left eye. The skull was broken so that several pieces was taken out.

He was taken to the house, where he died about 10 o'clock. The wound which produced his death, in all probability, was the result of a kick from one of the horses.

The circumstances attending the accident is explained as follows: going to the field he caught the horses, which are both blind, and latched them to the wagon, and had gone a few rods when some colts, which ran in the same lot, came around.
