Lexington, Oct. 15.—The funeral obsequies of Gen. Lee took place here today. The obsequies were very impressive and imposing, and were witnessed by an immense crowd of spectators. The funeral service of the Episcopal Church was read by Rev. Dr. Pennington. No sermon was preached, it having been the desire of Gen. Lee that none should be. The body was removed to the vault prepared for its reception.
The delegation appointed by the General Assembly of Virginia to attend the funeral and request the remains to be interred in the Holy Wood Cemetery, have left for Richmond. They received no positive assurance from the faculty of Gen. Lee that the request of the State would be granted. It is more than probable that it will be conceded at no distant day.
