THE FIRST NEWSPAPER IN AMERICA.
In Duckingham's "Newspaper
Specimens" we find that the first
attempt to set up a newspaper in North
America, so far as can be ascertained
from existing records, one from
London, was made in Boston in the
year 1689. Only one copy is known to
be in existence, and this is deposited in
the State Paper Office in London.

FORNEY'S "RECOLLECTIONS"
Forney in his "Recollections" tells
the following story of John Randolph's
peculiar speeches which he interlarded
with copious quotations in Latin and
Greek, Kremer rose, and in a strain
of well-acted indignation, poured
forth a torrent of Pennsylvania Dutch
upon the head of the amazed and startled

In 1841 an entire skeleton was
examined in the vicinity of Stockton,
in a marl pit. Its tusk were four
feet in length, and with the head bones
weighed nearly 600 pounds. It was
found near the surface, lying at an angle
of about forty-five degrees, deep
undermost. Portions of this, portions
of other twenty skeletons of mastodons
have been found in the Walkhill Valley.
One of these was the monster
that for years was the wonder of the
visitors at Pele's Museum, in New
York. There is in a Boston museum
the complete skeleton of a mastodon
exhumed near Newburg, only a few
years ago; a farmer taking an exposed
part of it to be a stamp, hooked his
oxen to it and broke off the tusk
which led to its discovery.
