A Train Stopped by a Mob

THREE MEN MURDERED IN COLD BLOOD.

HOLDEN, Mo. April 24.—A mob stopped the eastern bound train on the Missouri, Kansas & Texas R. R., at Gunn City, in Cass Co., this afternoon, and murdered G. R. Cline, J. C. Stevenson and Z. Dutton.

A correspondent of the Journal of Commerce, writing from Washington, says: "A census of Democratic Congressmen shows that forty-five are in favor of the 'passive' policy; thirty-one in favor of holding a National Convention of the party and nominating candidates, and a few are in favor of an out-and-out Democratic platform and ticket."
