WASHINGTON, May 2.—Those partisans who have continuously of late allowed their ignorance of the simplest principles of book-keeping to precipitate them into assents upon the Administration, received on Saturday a reply to Mr. Peck's customary misstatement of facts renewed on Saturday last. It is specific and conclusive. It was presented in the House to-day, accompanied by a letter from Gen. Dyer, in response to Fernando Wood's attack. Mr. Wood has retracted his charges with something of good grace.

WAR DEPARTMENT, April 29. Dear Sir: I send herewith, in accordance with your verbal request of to-day, a statement in regard to the amounts received and disbursed by the department on account of the appropriation for ordnance, ordnance stores, &c., for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1871. Hon. Mr. Peck, in his speech in the House of Representatives, on Saturday last, remarks: "During the last fiscal year, in defiance of that act of July 13, 1870, the War Department, as it is called by the report of the Secretary of the Treasury, expended \$9,000,000 in excess of the appropriations, and sold arms to the French to make good the deficiency, and the proceeds of these arms are now deposited in the Treasury to the credit of that department."
