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GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE.

At the close of another year of unimpaired health, prosperity, abundance and peace, fervent expressions of our thankfulness are due to Almighty God for these signal manifestations of His favor. While in honoring our sacred duties of devotion to the laws of the State, and in the discharge of our various public and private duties, we are reminded of the many blessings which have been bestowed upon us, and of the many obligations which we owe to our Creator and our Country.

The condition of the State is such that it would be well to review the past year, and to consider the measures which have been taken to improve the condition of the State. It is the duty of the Governor to report to the Legislature the state of the State, and to recommend such measures as may be necessary to improve the condition of the State.

REDUCTION OF THE FOREGOING DEFICIT.

It is believed that the present fiscal year will show a further reduction of the deficit. The same system of accountability is applied to the management of the State, and it is believed that the deficit will be reduced to a large extent.

INTEREST TO DEPOSITORS.

Interest to depositors. Five per cent is believed to be maximum which these institutions can afford to pay. If actual rates are applied to their transactions, it is also recommended that no interest be paid on deposits of less than \$100.00.

The National Guard consists of eight divisions and 20 brigades, distributed as follows: One regiment, one battalion and nine separate troops of cavalry; 12 battalions of artillery; 31 regiments, 12 battalions and three detached companies of infantry, making an aggregate force of 25,300.

STATE LIBRARY.

The State Library, both in its general and its special departments, has been organized, and it is believed that the library will be of great benefit to the State.

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
