The Farm and Dairy.
State Grange of Patrons of Husbandry
 The "New York State Grange of Patrons of Husbandry" met at Albany on the 18th ult., and remained in session three days. The following resolutions embody the views of the associations:

1. Approving the institution of the Order as calculated to promote farmers' interests, but not antagonistic to those of others.
2. Endorsing the statement of the objects of Order made by the National Grange at its recent meeting at St. Louis.
3. Demanding such legislation as will open and improve channels of traffic, natural and artificial.
4. Recognizing railroads as indispensable and essential to fair interest and compensation for capital invested, but not on watered stocks.
5. Asking the repeal of all town bonding laws.
6. Demanding laws making pro-rata freight tariffs imperative.
7. In favor of the proposed Canal Debt Funding Amendment to the State Constitution.
8. Asking the Legislature to pass or amend laws so that rates of assessment for taxation shall be equal to all, and all property shall be assessed to tax full and fair value.
9. In favor of Free Banking judiciary organizing to the Rural Home.
10. Expressing sympathy with all well-considered movements for the improvement of the liquor traffic.
11. That the Grange is not a political organization, yet it is the duty of members to vote only for men who will administer the office of government in an honest and equitable manner, and that farmers as a class are entitled to better representation of their interests in all branches of government.
12. That it is the duty of farmers to render their homes attractive, and to make better provision for the intellectual wants of their families.

How to Kill Potato Bugs.
 M. A. S. of Getzville Ind. writes thus to the American Rural Home: "I bought a pound of Paris Green for six cents, mixed it with two gallons of fine wood ashes; punched an oyster can full of small holes in the bottom, then nailed a handle six feet long to fill the can with the mixture, and when the vines were well up and began to rain, I dusted them, giving the leaves a slight covering of it. One going over was enough, except when they were very numerous, and then I sometimes went over parts of the patch two or three times. This was done in four or five pounds of Paris Green would kill all the bugs on an acre; at least it would if I have ever seen, and I have seen them as thick as they get. I have no doubt that you will have dozens of remedies given you, 'how to kill bugs,' but this will be found the cheapest, safest, simplest, and most method adopted that ever did save a patch from destruction. I am a practical farmer, and know what I speak."

A Model Ben House.
 C. S. Andrew of Collins Centre, has a hen-house that exceeds anything of the kind we ever saw. It is well constructed frame building, not uncommonly large, well ventilated and lighted, and has a chimney equal to some dwellings. It contains a stove which is covered with a rack to prevent the hens from coming in contact with the heated iron.

Now for the fruit of Mr. A's labor. An old hen, added by the farmer, kept a tin stove, succeeded in hatching one chicken from a nest of eggs early in January. This chicken has braved the many cold days since its early birth in these comfortable quarters.

Mr. A. says the old hen has laid another batch of eggs, and is now sitting again, but continues to hover this chicken.

Important Items for Farmers.
 A president of an agricultural society calls attention to the fact that there are in a standard legal barrel, only one hundred quarts, while the ordinary four-barrel most in use among the farmers in the sale of potatoes and apples, contains nearly one-eight more. Farmers sell their produce in four barrels, and merchants transfer the same to standard barrels, making a profit on quantity as well as on price. In the sale of eight hundred barrels of potatoes from a farm, the proprietor loses one hundred barrels, worth \$200, for which he might as well be paid. The standard, not the customer, profits by this. Farmers see to it that they employ the one hundred quart barrel hereafter.
