

A Legislative Record.

Believing that it is the duty of the voters to know at all times how their representatives vote and just what is accomplished by their acts we take pleasure in presenting to our readers a brief sketch of the work our faithful assemblyman, Hon. M. M. Congdon has done during the past year.

The bill granting Carter Morgan satisfaction for damages connected with the reservoir, was passed and should have been a law but Gov. Flower—probably thinking Mr. Morgan was a Republican, put a veto to it.

The compromise bill in the land apportionment bill was introduced by Mr. Congdon. This provided for the admission of all agricultural societies on a basis proportionate to their premium lists to the benefits of school of the county fair fund.

The inhabitants of school district No. 1 in Wellsville held a meeting and voted bonds for the erection of a new school house. Owing to some trifling irregularity in the call the bonds were not legal and application was made to our Member for assistance. Word was received by him on a coming and the following morning a bill bearing the title of said school district was passed by the Assembly.

The bill to exempt the counties of Allegany and Cattaraugus from the publication of the session laws was at the request of the Board of Supervisors brought up by our Member. This bill differed from the one known as the Skinner bill, which provides that all measures purely local shall be published at the expense of the county, while other laws shall be published at the expense of the state.

Best of all, the infernal Halfshire nuisance is abolished and we are no longer at the mercy of a few politicians. We are proud of this record and wish to again remind this county that Hon. M. M. Congdon is most emphatically a good man to have in Albany.
