Believing that it is the duty of the voters to know at all times how their representatives vote and just what is accomplished by their acts we take pleas-uce in presenting to our readers a brief sketch of the work our faithful assem blyman, Hon. M. M. Congdon has done during the past year, Some of this, perhaps the most of it is already known to the readers of the Patriot, but it will be a good thing for all concerned to have it reviewed. Being a member of an exceedingly small minority, not much pull could be looked for; but Mr. Congdon always possessed a faculty of getting what he went after and it in no wise deserted him in Al-

bany.

The bill granting Carter Morgan sat. isfaction for damgages connected with the reservoir, was passed and should have been a law but Gov. Flower-pre bably thinking Mr. Morgan was a Republican, put a veto to it.

The compromise bill in the land ap portionment bill was introduced by Mr Congdon. This provided for the admission of all agricultural societies on a basis proportionate to their premium lists to the benefits of Shutum of the e unity fair found. This was an excellent measure and one that would have been a positive benefit to those agricultura societies that have arisen from a need and have been maintained largely by private money and enterprise. This bill was not destined to become a law, for Gov. Flower not finding any meat for his tiger in it, vetoed it.

The bill to exempt the counties of Allegany and Cattaragus from the publi ation of the session laws was at the re quest of the Board of Supervisors I cought up by our Member. This bill forced to the front the one known as the skinner bill, which provides that all measures purely local shall be published at the expense of the county, while other laws shall be published at the expense of the state. Thus, Allegany county is one-sixtieth of the state under the old law of publication, but under the new law is only one-two hundred and fortieth. This makes New York city bear a proportionate share of the expense. The actual reduction in the cost of printing to the tax-payers of this county is about three-fourths and not one-fourth as stated in the Buffalo Express. This will would never have come to light had not Mr. Compton who exists a first factor of the control o not Mr. Congdon made a vigorous effort for his bill.
