Washington, July 4, 1892.

President Harrison's appointment of Mr. John W. Foster, of Indiana, to be Secretary of State is the most talked of event of the week.

Gen. B. F. Butler, who has occupied a conspicuous position in several Presidential campaigns, was at the Capitol this week.

Representative Jerry Simpson, before leaving for the Omaha convention with his Alliance colleagues, said: "The politicians who are not in the touch with the people's party have no sort of idea what a serious and important movement this is."

There is a bare possibility that there will be another silver fight in the House before the close of the session, and in order to prepare for it Representative Pierce, of Tennessee, who was Mr. Bland's lieutenant in the last fight, has introduced in the House Senator Stewart's amendment to the free coinage bill passed by the Senate which provides for the free coinage of all silver except that from foreign countries.
