EDITOR NEWS:-Will you permit me to say a few words through your valua ble paper in support of our native cows Mr. Clark says his herd of imported cows has beaten my herd of natives. If a person is about to engage in business. he will expect to get returns in accord with the amount of capital invested. My native cows cost in the fall from \$12 to \$20. Mr. Clark values his at three or four times this amount. There are many native cows that will give from 50 to 72 pounds of milk per day, and they can be purchased for much less money than imported ones that will give the same quantity of milk. There ire farmers in this section who ran in debt for their farms, and made dairying their business, who are worth from \$15,000 to \$20,000. These men have stuck close to native cows and have had nothing to do with imported stock Now, if Mr. Clark can give the name of one man within ten miles of Andover who has kept imported cows, and car make this showing financially, I will give up beaten. There has never been any inducement offered to bring our native cows to perfection.
