Work at the Pump Station.

J. C. Smith, of the National Transit Co., is at the Pump Station preparing for a summer's work. An equal number of high-pressure boilers will be put in. Only one at a time will be changed so as not to interfere with the regular system of pumping. This will make the work extend over several months.
