Last week Tuesday Hon. Warren B. Hooker was unanimously renominated for Member of Congress from the 34th District, at the Convention held in Olean. That Mr. Hooker has proved himself a competent and able public officer is admitted by every person who has kept himself posted on congressional matters. Of course Mr. Hooker has stood squarely which party lines have been drawn. has done much good work from a nonpartisan point of view. In securing legislation of interest to his constituents Mr. Hooker has been notably successful. An appropriation of \$20,-000 was obtained by him for Dunkirk of at least \$200,000 more. He also Globe. had ordered a survey of the headwaters of the Allegany river to prevent overflows. He had Dunkirk made a port of delivery under the immediate transportation act. His bill for a public building a Dunkirk has passed the Senate and is now awaiting the action of the House committee, while the bill for a public building at Jamestown has been so managed that it will probably become a law before this Congress adjourns. Among other measures which Mr. Hooker has been enabled to enact is one for the relief of Dr. Geo. W. Barr, formerly of Gowanda, and one granting a pension to Wells Cheney. Mr. Hoorker likewise turned his at tention to securing better mail ser vices for the citizens of the 34th dis trict, with the result that 30 new postoffices have been established and many mail routes extended or the ser vice expedited since March t 1801 when his term began.
