DEATH OF LUTHER GREEN.
The Oldest Inhabitant In This Section.

"Uncle" Luther Green died on Sunday, Oct. 2, 1892, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Geo. W. Probasco, about three and one half miles from this village, in the town of Independence, at the age of 96 years. The funeral services were held at the S. D. B. church in Independence Monday, Revs. H. D. Clarke and Jared Kenyon officiating. The burial occurred at the cemetery in that place.

Luther Green was born in August 1796, near Albany in this state. When about 16 years of age he came to Independence, and has lived in that town ever since, engaging principally in farming, also having been interested in the manufacture of lumber. Until within the past twenty years he was a very active, hard working man. He sowed the first grass seed ever sown in this county, and passed through scenes and endured hardships known only to the pioneers of bygone days. He was the father of eight children, two of whom, Mrs. H. C. Coleman of Alfred Centre and Mrs. Probasco, are living. He was also the grandfather of County Clerk George A. Green. His third wife survives him, at the age of 82 years.

Clean Up!
In all the large cities and in many smaller cities and towns vigorous measures are being taken to secure the best possible sanitary condition. This action is advisable at all times, but the "cholera scare" has incited health boards to increased action. It is probably a fact that cholera will attack no person who eats or drinks no impure food or water. A good authority says that "cholera is not contagious. Its germs do not permeate the air. They are not breathed into the lungs. The disease is not communicated by touch or contact. It is contracted only when germs are taken into the stomach with food or drink." We wonder how many homes there are in Andover where there is nothing filthy or impure around the premises? How many out houses which are exactly in the condition in which they should be? We think there are very few cases where something could not be done to improve matters. Andover people are not more careless in these respects than the people of other places, but it is a fact, and may as well be stated plainly, that there are causes, small in themselves perhaps, and apt to be overlooked, for diseases most dangerous in their character. You do not know in how many ways these "little things" are apt to affect the food and water you take and the air you breathe. The moral is plain—make everything rigidly clean and keep it so!
