DEATH OF LUTHER GREEN. The Oldest Innabitant In This Sec-

"Uncle" Luther Green died on Sunday, Oct. 2, 1892, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Geo. W. Probasco, about three and one half miles from this vil-lage, in the town of Independence, at the age of 96 years. The funeral services were held at the S. D. B.-church in Independence Monday, Revs. H.D. Clarke and Jared Kenyon officiating. The burial occured at the cemetery in that place.

Luther Green was born in August 8 1796, near Albany in this state. When about 16 years of age he came to Independence, and has lived in that town ever since, engaging principally in farming, also having been interested in the manufacture of lumber. Until within the past twenty years he was a very active, hard working man. He sowed the first grass seed ever sown in this county, and passed through scenes and endured hardships known only to the pioneers of bygone days. He was the father of eight children, two of whom, Mrs. H. C. Coleman of Alfred Centre and Mrs. Probaco, are living. He was also the grandfather of County Clerk George A. Green. His third wife survives him, at the age of 82 years.
