A NEW COUNTY SEAT.

Just when it is supposed that Allegany's County Seat matter is settled, not, perhaps, "to the satisfaction of all," but settled nevertheless, up holds the issue in a new quarter. A petition, numerously signed by residents of Belfast, Cananda, Centerville, Hume, and other places down the river, has been prepared and will be presented to the Board of Supervisors next month, praying that the County Seat of this county, with the Court House, Jail, Clerk's and Surrogate's offices, together with the Judge, Clerk, Sheriff, and all other persons, fixtures, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, etc. etc., be moved to Cuba. Cuba's village park is designated as the spot that shall contain the buildings.

That's right! Move the County Seat. Move it to Cuba. Move it to Friendship. Move it to Wellsville. Move it to Andover, or Belfast, or Angelica, or Birdsall. Pick it up, put it in your pocket, and take it somewhere, but for Heaven's sake, gentlemen, move it! Take it down to Ceres and put it on the line between New York and Pennsylvania. Bring it to Andover and set it as near the Brundage oil well as you can without letting it bang over into Steuben county. The map shows that North Cuba is a trifle farther west than Cuba, and on the line of the Tonawanda Valley and Cuba Railroad (defunct, of course, but so matter.) North Cuba is the place! By all means move the County Seat to North Cuba.
