

Time on Shipboard.

Eight bells, the highest number of tans, are rung at noon hour afterward. An even number of bells announce the hours of the day or night, an odd number the half hours. Thus, one bell after the noon hour means 12:30, two bells mean 1, and so on; seven bells in the morning designate the time for breakfast; eight bells at noon, dinner time; three bells, 5:30, supper time. The time of day is always divided by sailors according to the bells, and not by the hours, the bells
