DIG FIRE AT CANASERAGA.

According to Reports that Place is Nearly Wiped Off the Map.

Between twelve and one o'clock this morning fire broke out in the Crandall House at Canaseraga, and it was not extinguished until all the business places, about thirty dwellings, and many barns and other outbuildings were destroyed.

It was described to the NEWS representative to-day by a gentleman who was upon the scene, as being the most terrible conflagration that has occurred in this section in many years.

Canaseraga had no fire protection except a hand engine. The Hornellsville department was sent for, but it was nearly three hours before they could reach the scene.
