The Woman's Christian Temperance Union of Andover meets the first and third Thursday in each month.

Over one thousand persons in Kent, Ohio, signed the pledge and put on the white button or blue ribbon of the Railroad Temperance Association, during the meetings held by Jennie Smith, national railroad evangelist.

The World's W. C. T. U. so recently bereaved of its secretary, Miss Mary A. Woodbridge, has sustained the loss of another officer, Mrs. E. F. M. Williams, treasurer, who died March 28, in Montreal, Canada. Mrs. Williams was also President of the Dominion W. C. T. U.

The death of W. Jennings Demorest, April 9, deprives the prohibition party cause of one of its strongest supporters and the W. C. T. U. of a princely friend. His influence for temperance on the next generation, through the medal contest work inaugurated and supported by him, is inestimable.

The Board of Education of Rochester, will cooperate with the W. C. T. U. in the organization of Anti-Cigarette Leagues within the public schools, with the motto, "The cigarette must go; the public school boys say so." The plan is to establish such a league in every ward in the city.

Decoration Day will be kept by Pennsylvania white ribbons as "railroad day" in commemoration not only of the heroic sacrifice of our soldiers, but of the "brave" deaths of other boys in blue who fall day by day at their post in the faithful discharge of dangerous duties.

North Dakota defeated re-submission and passed a bill defining intoxicating liquors which will assist in enforcing prohibition; passed the bill subjecting any person found intoxicated in the street or in any public place to fine or imprisonment; gave county commissioners authority to send habitual drunkards to a reputable gold cure at the county's expense; enacted an anti-cigarette law; raised the age of consent from fourteen to sixteen years; passed a law suppressing obscene literature and pictures and papers devoted to reports and stories of vice and crime.
