NEAR-BY NEWS.

A Few Outside Happenings in Which Our Readers Will Be Interested.

The Board of Supervisors of Steuben county will meet June 11th to reappor tion the assembly districts of that county.

The county convention of the Alle gany County Y. P. S. C. E. will be held at Alfred Station, now Keller, the 23rd and 24th of this month.

There will be a meeting of the Alle gany County G. A. R. Association at Wellsville on Thursday, June 27, 1895. All G. A. R. men are asked to take notice.

The annual meeting of the county W. C. T. U. will be held at Almond, Wednesday and Thursday, July 24th and 25th. Mrs. Helen M. Barker will deliver the address, on July 24th.

At a special meeting of the voters of the union school district in Friendship the proposal to bond the district in the sum of \$8,000, to build the addition to the school building, was carried by a vote of 120 to 98.

A competitive examination of candi dates for the State Scholarships in Cor nell University falling to the county of Allegany, will be held in the Public School Building in the village of Bel mont on Saturday, June 1st, commencing at 9 a. m. Candidates must be at least sixteen years of age and six months standing in the common schools and academies of the State during the present school year.

Last Thursday while Postmaster Stillman was working on his farm clearing and picking brush, etc., a small hay stack stood in the field which was worthless, set it a fire by means of getting it out of the way. After the stack laid in ashes about, he found to his aston ishment a quantity of silverware, consisting of plated spoons, scissors, razors, etc. Having remembered that Claud Vincent's store, at Alfred Station, was broken open the same night that Almond was burglarized, notified Mr. Vincent of his discovery, and identified them as the articles taken from the store that night.—Almond Chronicle.

The Central New York & Western Railroad is to be standard gauged from Olean to Bolivar at once and a connect ing link built from Bolivar to Angelica, connecting with the standard gauge division to Hornellsville and Wayland giving Olean and the big saw mills be tween that city and Bolivar a direct connection with the Erie and Delaware Lackawanna & Western railroads. The broad gauge scheme has been talked of for many months and at last it seems the owners of the property, who are prominent New York capitalists, have decided to push the thing along with out further delay. The distance from Olean to Angelica via Bolivar is 40 miles. The first order for 10,000 cedar ties has been awarded to a Buffalo firm. The iron on the abandoned standard gauge branch from Belfast Junction to Angelica is being ripped up and will be relaid between Olean and Bolivar.
