**Scientific Temperance Instruction.**

As an attempt is being made to create prejudice against the "Ainsworth bill," now pending the Governor's signature, which provides for the study in the public schools of the nature and effects of alcoholic drinks and other narcotics in connection with Physiology and Hygiene, justice demands that the following facts be published:

Two or more years ago the New York State Association of Congregational churches, as a method of church work for the prevention of intemperance, urged upon its local churches the duty of visiting the public schools in aid of the enforcement of the Temperance Education Law enacted in 1884. This led to the conviction that a stronger law was needed. And this same association of churches last year instructed their temperance committees to petition the late Legislature for such a law. They were joined in this petition by the temperance committees and representatives of other religious denominations of this state, united under the name of the New York State Central Committee for Scientific Temperance Instruction in Public Schools. This Ainsworth bill is the bill which was presented to the late Legislature by this New York Central Committee.

Petitions for the enactment of this bill from all parts of the State were poured in on the Legislature until experienced legislators said that, "in all their legislative experience, they never received so many petitions and letters for any bill as this."

Because some person must look after the interests of this important public measure, in its various stages of passage through the Legislature, the New York State Central Committee deemed itself fortunate in being able to secure to represent them the services of Mrs. Mary H. Hunt.

The old law that has been upon the statute book for eleven years requires this study to be taught "all pupils in all schools." This bill does the same, but in addition provides for its being done.

The lack in providing suitable textbooks has been one of the reasons why the pursuit of this branch has been so much of a farce that the people want it remedied.

The enactment of this law may require at first some new adjustment in the courses of study of some schools which may throw upon superintendents where the study has heretofore been neglected some additional work, but the legislators said, "the school men are paid for doing that sort of work, and we must consider what the people want taught rather than what the teachers want to teach, or the superintendents want to arrange for."

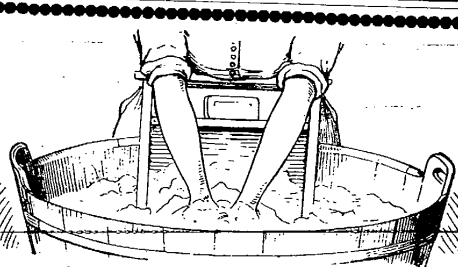
