"Why," the clerk exclaimed in amazement, "when does Mr. Bujean have a chance to wear such garments as these?"

The little woman replied, "They are Mr. Bujean's clothes, but I use them. I have no right legally to call my wearing apparel my own." "In this way," she said to me, with a gleam in her eyes that spoke volumes, "I am trying to agitate the woman question, and bring men to see the injustice of it all."

The English woman suffragists have collected and published in the London Echo opinions from many of eminent divines, English, Scotch and Irish, in favor of extending full parliamentary suffrage to women. The list includes the Bishop of London, the Dean of Durham, Dr. James M. Martineau, Rev. Hugh Price Hughes, Canon Wilberforce, Dr. Newman Hall, the Bishop of Edinburgh and many others. The Boston Transcript says: "This does not look as if the 200,000 women in Great Britain who already possess the municipal suffrage had made bad use of it."

The Commissioners appointed to determine the matter of laying out a new road through portions of the towns of Andover, Greenwood and Hartsville, rendered their decision last week. It was decided not to allow the opening of the road.

The matter has been strongly opposed from the start, by residents of Greenwood and others.

The commissioners' expenses were \$140; apportioned as follows: To the applicants for the road, \$50; to the town of Greenwood, \$45; to the town of Andover, \$30; and the town of Hartsville, \$15. This does not represent the amounts paid out in various ways, for attorneys' fees, surveying, etc., which would bring the total up to a much larger figure.

The Belfast G. A. R. Post has erected a bronze monument sixteen feet high in the cemetery at that place in memory of the soldiers buried there. The names of the dead soldiers will be engraved thereon, and when public services in memory of the deceased are held, the comrades will gather around this monument instead of the different graves.

The following item has appeared in several papers, and we hope it's true: "The Hornesville board of aldermen have unanimously voted to accept the proposition of John Wood, of Arkport, to settle his judgment against the city of \$4,063.20. Under the arrangement \$1,000 must be paid on or before June 20 and the remainder on September 1st with interest. The full amount of the judgment and costs is \$4,463.20. An appeal in the case would have necessitated the printing of all the testimony at a cost of \$400, and attorney's fees of perhaps \$500 more, which in the event of possible defeat, together with interest would have incurred additional expense of about \$1,500."

Deiryemen and farmers in the south towns of Steuben and the greater portion of Allegany County are suffering from a scarcity of hay and in many cases farmers having from 20 to 40 cows have fed out their entire last year's crop. The hay crop through this section, with the most favorable of climatic conditions, will not be over a quarter of the usual crop. The farmers in some instances are now fitting their choice milk cows for market because they will have nothing on which to winter them. Some are plowing up their meadows and sowing to other crops.
