At a meeting of the Allegany County Publishers Association, held at Bolivar, April 29, 1895, the following rules were unanimously adopted to take effect the week beginning May 9, 1895:

Rule 1.—That not less than 5 cents per line be charged for resolutions or reports, and no more than 10 cents for notices, and 15 cents for notices of entertainments from which revenue is to be derived.

Rule 2.—Cards of thanks to be charged \$1.

Rule 3.—Ordinary notices, except such as are published as a matter of news, and lists of wedding presents to be charged for at not less than 5 cents per line.

What the W. C. T. U. Stands For.

The following are among the resolutions adopted unanimously by the late great world's W. C. T. U. convention in London:

"Resolved, That the basis of this Society is total abstinence, total prohibition of the liquor traffic and the opium trade, the enfranchisement of women, purity of personal life, and international peace and arbitration, and we invite all earnest women who are like-minded with us to join our organization, put on the white ribbon and become soldiers of our peaceful war."

"Resolved, That we hereby reiterate the resolution first adopted by the crusaders of the rally in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1874, and which reads as follows:

Resolved, That recognizing the fact that our cause is, and is to be combated by mighty, determined, and relentless forces, we will, trusting in Him who is the Prince of Peace, meet argument with argument, misjudgment with patience, denunciation with kindness, and all our difficulties and dangers with prayer.

"Resolved, That the conflict in which we are engaged is so desperate that we need a union of all the forces we can command, and in the same catholic spirit which has characterized us in all the past, we welcome to our love and our labors all true women who will unite with us on the basis of faith and prayer and honest hard work."

A Woman Rules Wyoming.

Governor Richards, of Wyoming, who has been in St. Louis as an en campment visitor, has not allowed affairs of State to worry him. He knows that everything is all right at home, and his nineteen-year old daughter is in charge.

Every morning after breakfast Miss Richards looks over the Executive Mansion, instructs the servants, sees that the children are well, promises candy to all of them, makes out menus for the day, and then mounts her wheel for business. In the absence of her father, Miss Richards reaches the office earlier and remains later in the afternoon, but each day she telephones to the Mansion, gets the truth about the youngsters, and then sends a message telling the State's official record and the standing of the Richards household. These messages are concise; here is a specimen:

"Cheyenne, Wyo., July 4.—All quiet at the State-house. The Fourth is lively. The children are all well."

Sir Wilfred Lawson, the Neal Dow of England, tells this story on himself: "There was a school in the North of England, and the master gave the children a long disquisition upon the steam engine, and when he thought they all understood it, he asked, 'What is it that does the work of forty horses and drinks nothing but water?' and they all called out, 'Sir Wilfred Lawson.'"
