Resolved, That recognizing the fact that our cause is, and is to be combated by mighty, determined, and relentless forces, we will trusting in Him who is the Prince of Peace, meet argument with argument, mis-judgment with parience, denuncia tion with kindness, and all our diffiulties and dangers with prayer.
"Resolved, That the conflict in
