Articles of incorporation of the Erie Railroad Company, under the new re-organization plan, were filed with the Secretary of State at Albany Thursday morning. The capital is \$146,000,000, and the corporation tax of \$182,000 is the largest ever paid in the State. The payment of this tax was in accordance with a decision of the United States supreme court, that where a company is organized in the manner in which the Erie has been, the resulting corporation is a new one and subject to the payment of a tax of 1/2 of one per cent.

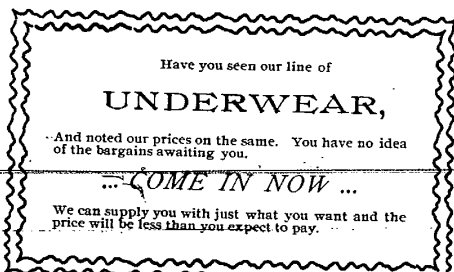
