Later, when the system was in use, it was found that the noise of the central station was such a constant disturbance to the nearby offices that the station had to be removed to another part of the

Every business has such experiences. Questions of procedure come up and quick decisions are given on slight evidence. Sometimes the decision is understood to be undebatable—it is yes or no, and that settles it.

The wise manager, while appreciating quickness, never secures it at the expense of thoroughness when it involves a decision upon which a course of events depends. And usually his decisions are open to argument from his lieutenants to make sure that all gides of the question are carefully con-
