Sometimes feeble human attempts to explain the inscrutable wisdom of the universe are tragic, as when the bereaved mother with upturned i eyes questions heaven, that-has "taken" her child, More often our h terpretations of the great law are childish--almost humorous.

But the other day the newspapers mentioned the sudden death o an atheist. He had defied the Divine Power to strike him dead, declaring that there was no Divine power. He dropped dead at once, and the breathless onlookers concluded that he had succeeded in evoking some special manifestation of power—that the forces and wisdom which rules all sins and all universes had come down on a special errand i to kill him. But this great hand of Eternal Law does not shut crush because of offenses against it. Eternal wisdom—unchangeable because it 13 wisdom—does not change its course to destroy him who in his blindness doubts.

The studies of men have thus far, with few exceptions, been mere speculations, and are therefore barren. Even in the material world |. we have but recently come to realize that law rules unchangeably everywhere. We used to imagine that we lived on a flat earth with a circular sun sailing around it, Farther back some of them thought that the earth rested on an elephant, others that it was carried on the back of a man who stood on the back of a tortoise. Recently we have found i. that law prevails in the forms of matter, in the attractions and move-

The drop of water that goes over Niagara is round and it rolls, as does the sun, or the drop of blood in your veins. Newton, the lion of thought, stopped the foolish questionings and guesses of men by the formulation of his one simple law of gravitation. He said with confidence that every atom of matter in the visible universe must obey this law, and every second has proven the truth of what he said. The child, who falls from a window must fall—it must obey the law of gravitation though it be dashed to destruction Eternal law is never changed, i. can not be changed.

When a scientist discovered that a planet in its journey around the sun suddenly went off at a tangent and temporarily changed its course it was announced with confidence that some great body in that part of space must be drawing it from its orbit. The telescopes began hunting, and in the depths of space a new planet was found.

We have made one little step in the direction of understanding law, For Rags, Rubbers, Metals, the steps you take. the immutable, the unchanging character of law, as applied to that which we call matter. One little law governing at least our little corner of revealed space is known to us. The other and greater laws are MAX EPSTEIN not only unknown but entirely ignored and unsought. 


