The woman suffrage bill, indorsed by all the National political parties and backed by both the Democratic and Republican State organizations, is expected to receive an early consideration in the New York State Legislature. The passage of this bill, together with the favorable action by the 1916 Legislature, will make it possible for the citizens of New York State to vote in favor of woman suffrage on election dag, 1917.
