**INTERESTING NEW YORK STATE PARAGRAPHS**

Open now has 24 saloons. Under the terms of the Brown excise bill it will lose 16. Senator Wadsworth will be the speaker at the Memorial day exercises at Genesee. Bath's village tax rate this year will be \$12.40 per \$1,000, an increase of \$1.78 over last year.

Francis G. Coffey of New York has been nominated by President Wilson to be United States attorney for the Southern district of New York. "Springtime prayers for successful crops were offered last week on the estates of the Hudson river millionaires' colony around Hyde Park. George Stein, a Medina brewer, has gone into the dairy business, starting with a herd of 22 cows. He is selling milk at seven cents a quart.

Mrs. Hattie Webster, a Niagara Falls negress arrested for disorderly conduct, was released when she told the court she was the mother of 23 children. The 18th annual session of the State Assembly, Daughters of Rebeccah, I. O. O. F., was held in Utica. Saratoga was chosen for the 1918 gathering.

Joseph Hodges Choate, former ambassador to Great Britain and a lawyer of international fame, died suddenly of heart disease at his home in New York city. Governor Whitman has signed the Everett bill extending to children under 13 the present prohibition against the sale of tobacco to children under 16 years of age.

A campaign to enroll 1,000,000 residents of New York state in the American Red Cross was begun at Syracuse at a conference of 250 Red Cross workers from all sections of the state. Frequenters of amusement resorts may no longer enjoy themselves legally by throwing balls at a negro's head. Governor Whitman has signed the Murphy bill making such pastime a misdemeanor.

A resolution favoring national prohibition during the war was adopted by the New York State Congregation at conference and a telegram sent to President Wilson informing him of the action taken. Judges convicting Joseph Torrance and Morris Hoffman of New York of violating the law prohibiting bookmaking without writing on New York race tracks were sustained in the court of appeals without opinion.

The Wells bill to authorize a commission to determine if and how much National Guardsmen who served on the Mexican border last summer should be paid by the state in addition to their regular federal pay was signed by Governor Whitman. Immediate preparations have been begun by the U. S. war department, through the Eastern establishment mobilization camp at the state fairgrounds at Syracuse for the reception of regular army troops from the border.

Seventy-three men of Fairport have now taken up the work of drilling twice each week under the direction of Drillmaster Chester B. Hull as a home defense contingent. The matter of providing uniforms is being looked after by Arnold J. Lamb, chairman of the military committee. Under a plan announced, Rochester school children will subscribe \$75,000 to the Liberty loan.

Speaker Thaddeus G. Sweet of the assembly named the following as members of the war committee, which was created at the recent session of the legislature: Alder, Machold, Law, Malone, McGinness, Kassen, Green, Zimmerman, Bell, White, Yonke, Calahan, Bush, McEllick and Barra.

Some Dayton's milk condensory company has long been bothered because of lack of an adequate water supply. Recently a well was driven near its plant. At a depth of 400 feet a tremendous flow of water was struck. Clean washed gravel accompanied the water, indicating that a subterranean creek has been struck.

The entire line of the Buffalo, Atica & Arcade railroad, with its engines, stations, engines, stock and equipment, extending through the counties of Erie, Warren and Cattaraugus, will be sold under foreclosure at the Wyoming county courthouse, Warsaw, on May 25. The road was taken over by the Pennsylvania railroad company.
