CALIFORNIA MEN AND SUFFRAGE

California is the most recent of the equal suffrage states to recognize the importance of equipping women with the ballot as a constructive war measure. That women will bear the burden of war equally with men is distinctly set forth in a memorial to Congress in behalf of a Federal amendment urged by the California legislature.

The petition, introduced at the request of Mrs. Alfred Bartlett of Los Angeles, a member of the National American Woman Suffrage Association, on behalf of the federated clubs of the state, took precedence over all other business. Without a dissenting vote it passed both houses in just twelve minutes. The text of the California memorial follows:

WHEREAS, the women of the United States are being called upon to share the burdens and sacrifices of the present national crisis, and WHEREAS, they are patriotically responding to that call, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate of California with the Assembly concurring, that the denial of the right of women to vote on equal terms with men is an injustice, and be it further

RESOLVED that we do urge upon Congress the submission to the Legislatures of the states for their ratification, an amendment to the United States Constitution granting women the right to vote.

While less than half the manhood suffrage states are found in the prohibition column.

THIS COUNTY'S FARM NEEDS

According to the census taken by the New York State Food Supply Commission Allegany county needs 2,537 laborers of which 1,202 may be boys of high school age. It needs 678 women for household help of which 149 may be school girls. There are 302 fewer hired men in this county than there were last year.

The census shows 1,061 dairy cows wanted and 1,085 for sale. The heifer calves wanted number 1,463 with 669 for sale. The figures on sheep show 752 ewes wanted with 270 for sale. There were 199 work horses wanted and 369 for sale. Brood sows wanted numbered 28 with 81 for sale. The demand for pigs totaled 1,497 with 1,197 offered for sale.

Figures on seed gave for alfalfa 268 bushels wanted with none offered for sale; potatoes 13,672 bushels wanted and 7,465 bushels for sale; field beans 2,202 bushels wanted with 1,003 bushels for sale; buckwheat showed 4,704 bushels wanted with 2,018 bushels for sale; corn 4,934 bushels wanted and 195 for sale; spring wheat demands were for 876 bushels with 16 bushels offered for sale.

Further details of the census in this county and names of those having seed and animals for sale may be secured from the county farm bureau agent representing the New York State Food Supply Commission whose headquarters are at Belmont.
