CAN OR DRY ALL SURPLUSES

In order to thoroly learn our lesson of economy during the coming summer, one most important point must not escape us. Never before in our history has there been such a crop of small fruits and vegetables as will be produced this season. These, if we are not extremely careful, will by their very profusion go to waste.

We must remember that every piece of fruit and every vegetable has a market value.

True we may not need them ourselves, but others will. There will be an urgent demand for every can of fruit and vegetables, and for every pound of the same that can be dried.

Families should, if necessary, make a little sacrifice of time and labor in order to save the surplus from the gardens and orchards and truck patches throughout the summer.

The government will be in the market for enormous quantities of these goods and will in large measure absorb the output of the big canneries. This will leave the local dealers to depend upon the small canners and individual families for their supply.

It will greatly facilitate matters if neighborhoods will cooperate and establish small community canneries that can take care of the surplus fruit and vegetables as they accrue. But when this is not done every family should follow a firm determination that nothing shall go to waste.

NOTICE OF MILITARY CENSUS AND ENROLLMENT

To All Persons Between the Ages of Sixteen and Fifty Years Inclusive Within the County of Allegany

Pursuant to the rules adopted by the Governor of the State of New York in his Proclamation dated June 6, 1917, in accordance with Chapter 103, Laws 1917, and an amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, I do hereby make, publish and declare the following Order for the taking of the said Census and Inventory and Enrollment required by said Proclamation to be taken, and I hereby designate the manner in which said Census and Inventory and Enrollment for the county of Allegany shall be taken between June 11th and June 25th, both inclusive, as follows:

- The said Census and Inventory and Enrollment of all persons subject thereto shall be effected by such persons presenting themselves in person at one of the registration and enrollment depots hereinafter specified and answering the questions printed on the census forms and signing the same and a registration card. Such registration and enrollment depots will be open between the hours of 9 A. M. and 9 P. M.
- Nothing in the foregoing shall be in derogation of, or impair or limit, the right of the Director of Census and Enrollment Officer for this county and his assistants and agents at any time and place to go to the homes and places of business of all those subject to said census and inventory and enrollment, who have not presented themselves for registration and enrollment at the registration depots hereinafter designated and then and there require all such persons to answer the questions printed on the census forms and sign the same and a registration card.
- Attention is called to the following extract from the Governor's Proclamation dated June 6, 1917:

"I DO HEREBY notify and warn all persons that anyone who neglects or refuses to appear personally when called upon so to do, by or before those authorized to command his appearance, or who makes incomplete or equivocal or wilfully false or misleading answers, or who refuses to be sworn, or in any manner neglects or fails to comply with this Proclamation or with the regulations issued and to be issued in conformity herewith, or by authority hereof, for the purpose of completely effecting the census, inventory and enrollment herein ordered and directed, will be liable to arrest and imprisonment as by law provided."
