HIGH SPIES

Perhaps a million people know
 it when the men who were to
 surprise Pershing's force sailed
 from Atlantic ports for France.
 The strange part of the sub-
 marine attacks lies in the fact
 that the transport fleets took an
 unusual course in going across
 the Atlantic, and the ships went
 far south of the regular lanes of
 travel. There was an agreement
 that the vessels would meet in
 certain latitude and longitude, far
 from where submarines have been
 accustomed to operate. When the
 American fleet met at their rendez-
 vous on the high sea, the
 German submarines were also
 there, waiting to attack the trans-
 ports. Therefore it is plain that
 the Germans received advance
 information that was guarded by
 officials in Washington with the
 utmost secrecy. There are spies
 in high places in the United States
 Government—that is the only
 conclusion to be deducted from
 the circumstance.

There are many ways in which
 the news outlined above could be
 sent into Germany; but there are
 very few ways in which it might
 become known outside the Navy
 and Army Departments that the
 fleets would meet at a certain
 spot in the Atlantic.

One of the greatest of the
 English visitors to the United
 States, whom we are not able to
 quote, recently outlined the strug-
 gles that England had with the
 spy system of Germany. He said
 that English speaking people like
 those in his own and this country
 were very slow to comprehend the
 intrigues of German spies, since
 such methods were foreign to our
 way of thinking. But he warned
 Washington that the city was
 filled with spies. Evidently he
 knew just what he was talking
 about.

White House Pickets

The women who have been ar-
 rested in Washington for carry-
 ing banners are among the most
 prominent workers for the cause
 of suffrage. One is apt to think
 that altercations with the police
 usually take place between peo-
 ple of coarse natures, and with a
 lack of understanding of what the
 law means. That impression has
 gone out in this instance, and it
 is entirely wrong. The picketers
 are made up of a fine class of
 women, who believe they have a
 perfect right to carry on their
 plan of creating public opinion in
 the way they have started. Cir-
 cuses come to town, and parade
 in the public streets; parades of
 all kinds march up and down.
 Then, say the suffragists, why
 should they be prohibited from
 displaying banners in the interest
 of suffrage? The militant meth-
 ods of the National Woman's Par-
 ty have attracted wide-spread at-
 tention thruout the country. The
 ladies believe that their rows
 with the Washington police have
 helped the suffrage cause. Lots
 of people agree with them; and
 lots more seem to think their
 method is wrong. However, all
 who know the women agree that
 they are plucky, intelligent, and
 of the kind who are willing to
 "do and die" for their principles.

Thousands Learning French

America is forming rather a
 close co-partnership with France,
 and thousands of people, including
 soldiers and sailors, are learning
 the French language. The Ber-
 litz Schools in Washington and
 New York are enjoying a regu-
 lar rush of business, as they are in
 the principle schools of language
 in the country. The Spanish
 tongue also appears to have be-
 come popular. Many of those
 taking up French expect to take
 part in the war on French soil,

Censoring the News

With only one or two unin-
 portant exceptions all foreign
 and military news items that the
 Government has desired sup-
 pressed, has been voluntarily
 withheld by Washington writers
 and newspaper publishers. The
 censorship "on honor" appears
 to be working quite satisfactorily.
 However, Secretary Baker of the
 War Department, has recently
 done a little censoring on his own
 account. It is probable that the
 censorship will finally be placed
 in operation so as to cover mili-
 tary and troop operations, and
 the development of new invention.
 The freedom of the press, per-
 mitting the criticising of officials
 and measures, will likely not be
 changed in any way.

Cuba's Front

Cuba is said to be enjoying a
 wonderful prosperity. The last
 time the United States went to
 war it was for the purpose of
 freeing the oppressed Cubans.
 Now Cuba has shown that she is
 our ally, and has backed up her
 position by declaring war against
 Germany. The little country is
 also building a very substantial
 embassy in Washington. Cuba's
