Sign-Boards on the Up-road

When one's life borders, extend to the thought of others how ever few, one is reaching up toward the life elevation which Jesus designates as belonging to the children of God. It is a far climb. What complicates our social scheme is the fact that individuals and groups representing every stage of evolution are jumbled together.

Lifting from the animal-soul whose interest is grossly self-up thru the various levels until we see the Christ-Man in whom God found exceeding joy. He above all others expressed the Mind of God—in motivation, of unselfish affection and in a life-plan is kind.

Somewhere between the hater and the Christ we all are, struggling upward some, content to be low and gross others, but differentiated by the magnitude of our affectionate nature. Expressed in scriptural terms the hater is dead. Those who love have experienced Resurrection unto Life.

He that loves knows God, and he that hates is, by that fact, in the abyss of darkness. Jesus setting forth the quality of spirit that was God-like turned away from abstract philosophy and laid down this unqualified test: "Love your enemies; do good to those who treat you unkindly, spitefully, discourteously, unfriendly, — that you may be children of your Father."

There are those who achieve this elevation, and they are thumb-marked with the Hand of God. Now, no one is obliged to love enemies or any one else. Most people give blow for blow and curse for curse. That is good jungle ethics. But if one desires to know God and inherit eternal life, he must be of the quality of God. That is evident.

Quality is the essence of the Religion of Jesus. Many systems denominated Christian attempt all sorts of subterfuges to inherit eternal life, resort to every device of charm and magic. He that loveth lives. He that hates is dead.

To love one's enemies is the acme of altruism. Jesus did it in a magnificent fashion, giving his enemies their way with Him without opposition or protest. They found a hideous joy in torture—the serpent-fashion of the species of haters who want the objects of their dislike to feel the stroke and blow and suffer humiliation and misfortune.

And the haters — serpent-wise — strike in the dark, attempt to ruin reputation by the leer, the grimace, by the false report, being glad to believe it, (whereas Love covereth up a multitude of sins) and so by every characteristic of the animal-nature which they are, they prove conclusively that the hater is potentially a murderer.

They attempt to kill souls! And they do it, very often, in the name of God, thus adding blasphemy to assassination. And they even speak Christ's name in prayer and pray His prayer.

And the Christ walking up and down the streets of men for whom He died beholding the glaring eyes of millions in warfare, beholding the conflict of capital and labor, beholding race-hate, beholding the warring sects, beholding the individual antagonisms, a long time ago said: —

"By this shall men know you are My disciples when you love one another."

Is He right? Does love mark a high spiritual elevation? Does it link one to God? Is it true manhood and womanhood? Is it the mark of Life? But what is more tragic to behold is this. That people do not love their enemies, but they do not love their friends!

It is a triumph of soul over self to love those who treat us unkindly or who hate us because we do not think as they do. But what manner of blindness is that which marks people who do not love their friends? Friendship is a contract between soul-What of those who allow the song of kindness to become a jangle of discord? What come to pass when "people do not respond to the overtures of affection? What chaos has come when human beings are content without the fine glory of fellowship? Consider a heart that is callous, stone-cold, without sympathy or compassion!

What declension is this that one is able to tread a desert, when friendship sings of the Garden of Joy our for the opening of a gate? What blight has struck hearts that do not rise to the God-like privilege of being cheerers, encouragers, helpers, inspirers, comforters, builders?

That having the opportunity of playing the part of Immortal Souls— Play the animal? It means that love is gone, that life hath taken her lamp and left the house. It means a wound in the heart of the Infinite God!

We do not live in a world but in a universe, and even the death ended all these there would be no justification for lack of human kindness. Nay, if for this little pilgrimage there was nothing at the end except the silence that fact would make love (seeing we have the capacity) the more imperative. We should lay hold upon every possible joy and cling to every moment of opportunity to show kindness. "For in a world of death there would be no time for hate." But we live in a universe with God supremely present. And because He is we must not fail our high destiny. In a world of life Love fulfills the Law.

And the weary tread the pitiless streets— And the blind grope with out-reaching hands— And the hungry-eyed look for the crumbs of love— And the bruised and burden-chafed do cry for bath— And the oppressed cry God for helpers— And the sin-marred long sympathy and lifting— And the broken long a steady-hand— And they in darkness of despair year for the passerby with lighted torch— And the hurt and stricken and smitten and the victims of the bigotry, narrow-mindedness, mercilessness, of the venomous haters, long for the God-sweet voice of friends.

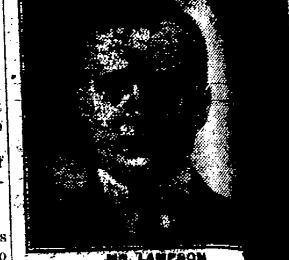
