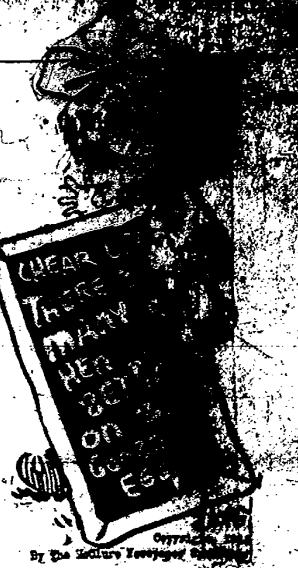

NEW LIBERTY LOAN

Mrs. F. Louis Blude, vice chairman of the borough of Manhattan for the Women Suffrage party and chairman of the war service committee, has been appointed as chairman for the second Liberty Loan campaign in the autumn. Mrs. Blude received her appointment through the Woman's Liberty Loan Committee, which is already making preparations for the second Liberty Loan campaign "to bring home to every woman the financial advantages and patriotic duty of investment in government bonds."

The New York State Woman Suffrage party, through Mrs. Frank A. Vanderbilt, in the course of the floating of the first Liberty loan sold over \$1,000,000 worth of Liberty bonds, more than half of all the Liberty bonds sold by the women of the Second federal reserve district.
