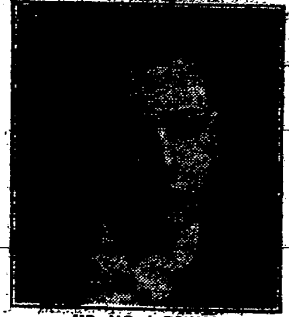
Potato digging is on in full force just now. Some fine ones are being dug.
