**"SAFE FOR DEMOCRACY"**

Just at this time the world is anxiously inquiring the inward meaning of President Wilson's immortal phrase, "safe for democracy."  
Just what is "safe," and just what is "democracy?"  
In the first place, safety, while it must contain the element of freedom, must not grant license. Safety means security—of the individual, the group, the community, the state, the nation, the world—security from the forceful encroachment of others. It must carry with it exemption from violence.  
Likewise democracy means freedom—of the individual, the group, the community, the state, the nation, the world—freedom in the enjoyment of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.  
But freedom, made absolute, would nullify safety and result in anarchy. Therefore freedom must be bounded by equity.  
The divine principle of right decrees that none shall climb to success on the downfall of another. Your brother's unmerited loss must not be your gain. And this must apply not only to individuals but to voluntary groups, communities, states, nations. It must be world-wide.  
Given a world-wide recognition of this principle, we have the very essence of democracy.  
When all individuals and groups shall recognize the rights of other individuals and groups, and concede them, then will the world be "safe for democracy."  
If any are inclined to paraphrase Plato and ask, "What is Right?" we would answer, and equitably allotment of the opportunities of earth and of life.

**THE MONROE DOCTRINE**

Every now and then we are met by the criticism that in entering the European war we are running counter to the Monroe Doctrine.  
These same critics would have us believe that this country has entered the conflict for the purpose of punishing one set of belligerents and avenging another set.  
The country should get right on this matter and forever silence the tongues of those who by these arguments would clog the wheels of progress at this time.  
Taking the latter count first, this country has no intention of punishing any nation, nor of avenging any. It has, however, a firm determination that the atrocities visited upon Belgium and other invaded countries shall have no chance of a duplication here.  
German apologists seem to forget that this country had ample cause for war before war was declared—cause, consisting of Germany's aggressions on this country and on its citizens. Many innocent American lives had been sacrificed to her unlawful and outrageous methods, and many indignities suffered, before this country decided to put a stop to them by force of arms.  
The wiley plea that we are going to war to avenge the wrongs of other people will not avail. Could that be established, it would really place us in an unenviable light. It would place us in the attitude of overriding a principle of action that for more than a century has been a veritable beacon star by which we have steered our national course—this same Monroe Doctrine.  
We listen with horror to a recital of German atrocities in Belgium, and a thought that such might come to our land and our people will no doubt nerve the arms of our fighting men. But this is in no sense the impelling motive of our action. That action was prompted by a condition that had grown intolerable—a condition of affairs entirely between this country and that, and having no relation to the affairs of any other country or people.  
And as the days pass and new chapters are added to the record of German intrigue, we can but marvel that those in authority in our government held their hands as long as they did.  
President Wilson has stated the matter clearly—the world must be safe for democracy. It most certainly is not so now.  
The government is threatening to stop to the slaughter of innocent lives. Similar action in the case of slaves would be of the same nature.

**SACRIFICES NOT WASTED**

Everyone Helps to Win the War by Food Saving  
"There need be no fear that sacrifices will be wasted." This is the word of Baron Rhonda, food controller of Great Britain, who says that every American is in a position to bring near the inevitable stonement for the brutal outrages in Belgium, Armenia, and Serbia, and sinking of the Lusitania and other horrors, by day-by-day economies. Unless the Entente Allies are able to import the supplies necessary for the armies and the population, victory may slip from our united grasp.  
America is asking every household, every hotel, restaurant, and dealer in foodstuffs in the nation to follow, in so far as circumstances permit, the suggestion that will be offered by the Food Administration as to measures of food saving.  
The pledge card to be signed is an enlistment, to help at home those who fight at the front. The New York State authorities are back of it. The State College of Agriculture, thru its home economics workers promises timely practical means which will help to carry out the purpose of the food saving campaign; they will print, from time to time, thru the columns of this paper.
