 In his heart are the qualities
 that respond to the wooing of
 God. We can think His thought;
 we can travel a little on the far-
 flung trails. We can at least be
 conscious that God must be.
 I love the hills.
 I love the vision of the hills.
 I quite understand why the
 Hebrew gropers after God
 phrased their religious discover-
 ies in figures of hills.
 It is a historical fact that the
 hill-people in all ages have been
 the seers, prophets, interpreters,
 discoverers, the forward moving
 trail-makers. The valley-people
 have learned how to dig and
 plant and weld and pile up riches
 but the hill-people have learned
 the secret-places of the unseen
 riches which are of the soul.
 Aaron, the priest, gave the
 people at the foot of Sinai a
 grand feast; and they capered
 and sang around the only god
 they had trust in—but Moses,
 the seer, was swept by the wings
 of the Infinite. The lowlanders
 had certain looks on their faces—
 but Moses had a shining quality
 that has illuminated the ages.
 Aaron was cunning with devices
 to please the groundlings—but
 Moses caught words that all the
 dynamite of evil cannot blast out
 of the thought of men.
 The valleys for wine and oil
 and the snug caravans for the
 body's hungers. The hills give
 seeing of the abiding. In the
 shadows of man's flimsy build-
 ings in the valley one loses per-
 spective—and the question of
 questions: what can I do to in-
 herit life, what shall I do to
 come into knowledge of God
 which is life? The spectacle of
 so many ways and the clack of
 so many truth-sayers.
 It is very simple.
 They shall know God when one
 is saturated with God's thoughts.
 They are interpreted in many
 ways, but in the simple truths of
 our Lord Jesus they are inter-
 preted in translatable terms.
 He sets Love as the goal.
 When we grow big enough to
 love we know God. This experi-
 ence, as Browning says, is our
 chance of learning the craft of
 Love.
 Life is a monstrous, hideous
 thing without Love as its goal.
 The sin above all is to take the
 other road. Whatever may be
 the joys of the other roads they
 cost life. There is no profit tho
 one win the world if one miss his
 own soul's true goal.
 There is this dread, that one
 may lose the way to his own
 soul's life.
 But he that loves knows God.
 In the genius of Jesus, relig-
 ious ideas we find the constructive
 love-principle affirmed as the
 ideal shining above every area
 of life. In individual life, com-
 munity, national, international,
 spiritual, here, there, everywhere,
 where the compass is set toward
 that which God is there will be
 Righteousness, justice, Friend-
 ship and by these roads one lifts
 to the supreme possibility of
 life.
 Above all mountains Calvary
 stands supreme. It is the spirit-
 ual landmark of the world. For
 there Jesus interpreted life that
 would be made abiding in the
 company of God, to be made so
 by the road of service.
 As we should expect Darkness
 in its many forms has tried to
 destroy this mountain. Ignorance
 superstition, materialism (the

sure road to hell) selfishness (the
 very devil) and unfraternity have
 sought to destroy the mountains.
 But the mountain is built into
 the human heart.
 Calvary commemorates no trans-
 action: no "scheme," no barter;
 no mechanical substitution. It is
 one of Love's landmarks, the
 highest one because a Son of
 God performed there a social ser-
 vice paramount.
 God is not ruling the universe
 by charms, fetiches, nor is He
 obliged to repair blunders.
 He rules the universe by the
 Laws of Life.
 When a Soul loves he is living
 the eternal life of quality.

Before the end of November
 the final official rulings regard-
 ing the automobile section of
 the tax law will be issued and
 at that time, payments under
 the war revenue act will be made
 in full. Among the new rulings
 the most important and one most
 appreciated is to the effect that
 used cars are not taxable whether
 held by wholesalers or manufac-
 turers.
 Under the new rulings, whole-
 salers, or combined whole-sale-
 retailers, holding new automobiles,
 including trucks, for sale at the
 opening of business October 4th
 last, are taxed 1 1/2 per cent. on
 the amount they paid the manu-
 facturers for the machines in ques-
 tion. However the dealers are
 not taxed on automobiles sold
 and delivered prior to May 9th
 last when title has been retained
 as security for payment of pur-
 chase money. The dealer who
 does a retail and also a wholesale
 business is subject to the tax as a
 wholesaler on all new automobiles
 held on October 4th, irrespective
 of whether they are subsequently
 to be sold at wholesale or retail.
 With one exception the taxes
 are collected from the seller of
 the car. The exception is: If
 the manufacturer, wholesaler, or
 wholesaler-retailer sells a taxable
 automobile to a dealer under a
 contract made prior to May 9,
 1917, then no matter what the con-
 tract has to say about the taxes,
 the dealer who buys the automo-
 bile must assume the tax and pay
 it over to the seller who in turn
 will pay the tax to the govern-
 ment.

One peculiar turn has developed
 in connection with the passing of
 the tax on by the manufacturer.
 The treasury department holds
 that the tax is levied not on the
 price, but on the amount received
 by the manufacturer. Hence, if
 the manufacturer passes the tax
 on, adding it to the bill, he must
 be taxed not on the price alone,
 but on the price, plus tax.
