INCOME TAX

Government Will Have Representatives in This County to Teach You

In a communication received by this paper, Collector of Internal Revenue Riordan announces that one or more Federal Income Tax Officers will be sent into the county of Allegany during the months of January and February next. Officers have been provided for them at the following listed places where they will be at the date set opposite each respective place, as follows:

- Cuba, Post Office Bldg., Jan. 2 to 12th.
- Belmont, Post Office Bldg., Jan. 14 to 19th.
- Wellsville, City Hall, Jan. 21 to March 1st.

They will be there every day ready and willing to help persons subject to the income tax make out their returns, without any cost to them for their services.

How many income taxpayers will there be in Allegany County. If you can guess how many married persons, living with wife or husband will have net incomes of \$2,000 or over and how many unmarried persons will have net incomes of \$1,000 or over this year, then you will know. The Collector of Internal Revenue estimates that there will be 1337 taxpayers in this county.

Returns of income for the year 1917 must be made on forms provided for the purpose before March 1, 1918. Because a good many people don't understand the law and won't know how to make out their returns, the Government is sending in this expert to do it for them. But the duty is on the taxpayer to make himself known to the government. If he doesn't make return, as required, before March 1, he may have to pay a penalty ranging from \$20 to \$1,000, pay a fine or go to jail. So if you don't want to take chances on going to jail, you better call on the income tax man. If you are not sure about being subject to the tax, better ask him and make sure. Whether you see the income tax man or not, you must make return, if subject to tax. Of course, persons resident in

other counties, to come and see the man, who will be listed above.

The collector says everybody start figuring out his income and expenses and be ready with the figures when the expert arrives. However, don't mean family expenses, money used to pay the principal of a debt, new machinery, buildings or anything like that. They mean what you spend in making your money, interest, taxes paid, hired help, amount paid for goods sold, stock bought for feeding, etc. (except for your dwelling) etc. Income includes about every dollar you get.
