Henry of Seneca, whose term as congressman for the Third district of the state expired with the last congress, was named a member of the local board to advise the 11 local exemption boards of Monroe county.

County Judge John E. M. Stephens and John Deamond, prominent in the Rochester bar, are the other members.

The deputy county fuel administrators of Seneca county appointed by A. B. Hughes, to be confirmed by the state fuel administrator, are as follows: W. D. Wheeler was appointed for Interlake, Charles O. Seely for Ovid, W. F. Beacon for Waterloo and J. W. Coryell for Varick. These various deputies will assist Mr. Hughes in the work in Seneca county on the coal situation.

Four women drivers appeared on laundry wagons in New York city for the first time. A large laundry company advertised several weeks ago for "women to do outdoor work for laundry," and received hundreds of replies, it is said. The president of the company declared that his firm was not satisfied with the quality of men engaged to take the places of employees now in war service and it was decided to employ women.

Coal dealers throughout New York state, according to information obtained at the office in New York of Albert H. Wiggin, state fuel administrator, are honoring pink coal cards which consumers may obtain by convincing their county administrators of an actual need of fuel. The cards call for one ton of coal, or for a greater amount if the applicant is a factory owner. Strict precautions have been taken to prevent hoarding, it was said.

Three men representing New York, one Mr. Hoover, food administrator, and one to be named by President Wilson, will control the food conservation in New York city, a conference to outline the work having been arranged for in Washington.

The Panama Traction company has a force of men with teams and wheel scrapers at work on their roadbed between Ashville and Panama. They have graded a long strip of roadbed and are now at work with men and teams within the village of Panama.

The annual meeting of the Orleans county farm bureau association will be held at the Albion court house on Monday, Dec. 10. Forenoon and afternoon sessions will be held. C. H. Betts, secretary of the state food commission, will speak at the afternoon session.

State troopers of the constabulary force are now busy in Niagara county. They are after transgressors of the automobile laws. Five such were rounded up in the vicinity of Barker and arraigned in Somerset courts, where they paid fines of \$5 each. The two troopers will continue patrol work in that county.

Wolcott has a milk maid who bids fair to establish a record for war services, while her father and brother are busy with work on the farm. Miss Irene Paylor, a girl who is only 16 years of age, distributes milk to 1,600 inhabitants of the village. Last summer the work required the services of a man and a boy.

Nearly all the farmers in the vicinity of Dansville have signified their willingness to join a farm bureau and the membership is rapidly increasing. Livingston county is striving for a membership of 1,000 and Dansville has exceeded its quota of twenty members, there being already 30 members enrolled.

State Committeeman George W. Aldridge has called off the annual blow out of the Monroe county Republican organization because he doesn't think it good taste during war times.

Health reports show 29 cases of smallpox in Buffalo, two in Niagara Falls and one at La Salle. All are among negroes and there will be vaccinations by the wholesale among colored people.

Six trolley companies operating in New York cities and villages, including Hornell, Canisteo and Ithaca, have been granted permission to increase their fares to six cents by the public service commission.

The Batavia chamber of commerce has made application to C. E. Treman, federal food administrator for the state outside of New York city, for the appointment of a food administrator for Batavia and vicinity.

That hearty team work is earnestly desired of the farmers of the state by the New York State Cannery's association, to provide supplies for the army and navy, was made plain at the association's meeting in Rochester.

George W. Hamlin, county fuel administrator, advises consumers of Ontario county that the coal situation in his district is approaching normal conditions rapidly and that they need not worry about their winter's supply.

A hog was brought into the Mader market which weighed exactly 500 pounds, the largest in weight ever brought to Danaville. It was raised by Isaac B. Knapp of Ossian. The sum of \$101 was paid by Mr. Mader for the hog.

The discovery at Syracuse of a quantity of dynamite by National Guardsmen foiled a plot, it is believed, to blow up the Orville aqueduct and flood tracks of the New York Central and West Shore, thus paralyzing traffic.

The Pavilion Natural Gas company struck gas last week in a well it had been drilling on the Patrick Quinlan farm, one mile south of Pavilion. The flow of gas is a little more than 500,000 cubic feet per day. During the summer drilling three dry holes were found.

The state received \$509,557 during November from stock transfer taxes, according to State Comptroller Travis. The total receipt since July is \$2,412,771. The cost of the collection of this revenue is the lowest of any of the state's taxes, amounting to about one per cent of the receipts.

For several weeks past many women have been employed as checkers on the platform in the freight transfer station at the Buffalo Seneca terminal yards at Manchester, but with the coming of the winter weather the women left the platforms clear to the men, the work being too heavy.

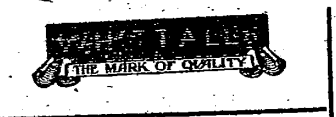
