held responsible for the payment will forward it to their corres of the check to the wrong per-However, if suspicious circumstances warrant such action. the paying teller will usually refuse to cash it until an investi ation is made.

In writing a check, take every are to protect yourself -against the dishonest intentions of future holder of the paper.

Never write or endorse a check with a lead pencil, but always with pen and ink. Commence to write the amount as far to the left as possible, so that no other word may be inserted before it. Fill up the remainder of the space with a line, so that nothing can be added after the amount.

Write your figures plainly and see that the amount in figures corresponds with the amount written Remember that unless ou take ordinary precautions to guard against fraud in the raising of a check, you are responsible for the consequence arising there

The presumption is that when hecks are drawn, funds will be provided at the bank on which they are drawn to meet them. Bu resentation for payment must be nade within a reasonable time. If not so presented, the holder must bear the loss, if the bank faila When persons receiving hecks are in the same place as the bank on which they are drawn, they should present the heck the same day, or at least the day after its receipt.

Depositing Before depositing your checks whether payable to your order or not, endorse them. If they are payable to another, of course that other party should first have en-dorsed either to you or in blank For instance, writing across the back of a check as follows, make the check payable only as ordered "Pay to the order of John Smith." (Signature of endorser.) This check would then be payable only after it was endorsed by John Smith.

Certified Checks

A certified check is guarante by the bank on which it is drawn to be good when properly en dorsed. This guarantee is written or stamped across the facand signed by the cashier or another officer of the bank.

A certified check is immediate ly charged to the drawer's ac count, thus avoiding all possibilment. A certified check should never be destroyed

In sending your check stranger at a distance it is usually advisable to have it certified. Especially is this so where you are in a hurry for goods ordered, it is oustomary and permis-le for those receiving checks from strangers to deposit and wait until they are collected Company will be held at the of

When a time draft is presented by the collecting bank, it is customary for the drawer to acknow ledge the obligation by writing across the face of the paper the word "accepted," followed by the date and his signature. This is a formal acceptance of the debt and is a promise to pay when due.

Lost Check or Draft

If a check or draft is lost, pay ment should be stopped by notifying the bank of the fact. Especially should this be done if the check is payable to bearer, as anyone coming into possession of

it may present it for payment.

If a check is lost by the lawful owner thereof and subsequently comes into the hands of a bona fide holder for value and without knowledge of the fact of its be ing lost, such holder is entitled to receive the amount from the bank and if it refuses payment by reason of instructions to that effect from the drawer, the innocent bolder may recover the amount troin the drawer.
