AMERICAN CAMPHOR FARMS There are few housewives in the United States who do not own and rely upon the camphor bottle to assist. · in healing the family aches and acci-; dents. While much of the camphor; "used in the United States is imported ; from Japan and China, it may be that some of our readers are not aware that camphor is being produced to day from camphor groves owned by the United States Department of Agriculture, near Palatka, Florida, where: they have a tract of 3,000 acres planted to camphor trees in long hedge rows. Only the leaves and small twigs are harvested from the sprawly trees. These are subjected to a distillation process. The camphor volatilizes under the action of the steam, passes, thru a condensor and is collected 1. gums and oils. The average yield of a tree, we are told, is about one-half ton of camphor. The cuttings are gathered once and often twice a year. The life of a good strong tree is five




