**WHICH CLAIMED FOR PAPER DRESS FORM**  
 Home Bureau Introducing It With Market Success

Presumably there are still women who would gladly do more of their own sewing if they were able to fit themselves and their children. Not only is the saving in cost an incentive, but as well as the satisfaction that comes from using one's ingenuity.

An appeal to these incentives is made at the County Home Bureau of the County, No. 127 East Avenue, where women are shown how to make inexpensive paper dress forms. Women deft in sewing and able to fit other persons are baffled when it comes to fitting themselves. It is said that this form has solved the problem.

The forms are made of one-inch gamed tape, which is pasted on a perfectly fitted foundation vest. After three layers of this paper have been applied the form is cut in back and front and slipped off. It is then fast-

ened together and attached. A band may be inserted and placed on a similar standard to make the model the exact height of the person. As the form is made to extend over the hips, the model serves in fitting both waists and skirts.

More than fifty leaders from various home bureaus in this vicinity attended training schools held in Rochester and Brockport in January, and learned how to make the forms. To date more than two hundred of them have been made at group meetings. Besides being used for fitting one's self, the forms may be sent to the dressmaker or tailor by the woman who is not able to stand to be fitted.

"This form is a fine thing," said Louis Lebowitz, a women's tailor, yesterday. "The average woman cannot fit herself perfectly because both sides of her figure are not precisely alike. On a perfect dress form a woman could express her own fancy, and save money besides."

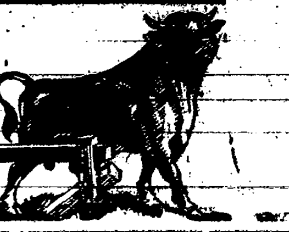
