THE U. S. WEEKLY MARKETGRAM

Latest Price Quotations Received From the U. S. Bureau of Markets Covering Produce and Feeds

(Washington, D. C., for the week ending March 21, 1921.)

HAY: Receipts generally light, values well maintained. Arrivals Chicago increasing; advices of country loadings to Chicago decreasing. Spring work and bad country roads still restricting heavy movement. Eastern and Southern markets report very little inquiry from outside points. No. 1 Timothy in good request in Philadelphia at \$1 per ton advance. Pacific coast markets weak because of improved pasturage conditions. Clover and clover mixed in good supply in the Carolinas but in light request. Alfalfa receipts increased materially in Western markets. Good demand from feeding sections. Prairie hay held steady, good Southwest prairie meeting with ready sale in Chicago. Chicago buyers not interested in South Dakota prairie. Quoted: No. 1 Timothy \$25 Chicago, \$26 Philadelphia, \$24 Pittsburg, \$24 Cincinnati, \$25 Minneapolis; No. 2 Timothy \$20 Chicago, \$24.50 Baltimore, \$24 Memphis, \$17.50 Minneapolis, \$24 Chicago, \$25 Cincinnati, \$21 Minneapolis; No. 1 prairie \$19 Chicago, \$12.50 Omaha, \$16 Minneapolis.

FEED: Market weak; demand lacking; offerings, especially for April May shipment, more liberal. Bran and middlings down \$1 to \$2 in Western markets; other wheat feeds declined proportionately. Cottonseed meal off 50c to \$1 and selling at new low levels. Linseed meal steady; stocks of lower grades fairly adequate. Gluten feed demand light; hominy feed sluggish. Transit shipments most feeds quoted at discount under shipment prices. Still lower prices expected by dealers unless there is a decided change in the general feeling. Quoted: Bran \$20.50, middlings \$20.50, flour middlings \$25, red dog \$30, Minneapolis; No. 1 alfalfa meal \$18 Kansas City, \$20.50 St. Louis; linseed meal \$41.50 Buffalo, \$49 Minneapolis; gluten feed \$37 Chicago; best pulp \$32 New York and Baltimore; white hominy feed \$23 St. Louis, \$24 Chicago.

GRAIN: The world economic situation continues a depressing factor in the grain market. In addition crop conditions have been favorable and stocks lower than the past week. The 1921 sales of 5,000,000 bushels of wheat in Europe and further reports

hogs up 10c; bacon down 7c; bulk of sales down \$2 to \$4. Beef steers down 10c to 25c; butcher cows and heifers practically steady. Feeder steers steady to 2c lower; heavy lambs down 7c; light lambs steady, feeding lambs steady to 8c lower. Yearlings unchanged. Fat ewes down 25c. March 21 Chicago prices: hogs, bulk of sales \$9 to \$11; medium and good beef steers \$9.40 to \$10; butcher cows and heifers \$5 to \$9.25; feeder steers \$7.75 to \$9.50 light and medium weight veal calves \$9.50 to \$12; fat lambs \$7.75 to \$10.75; feeding lambs \$7.25 to \$9.25; yearlings \$7.50 to \$9; fat ewes \$4.75 to \$6.25. Eastern wholesale fresh meat markets were generally lower, pork loins down \$2, beef \$1 to \$2 per 100 lbs. Veal steady to \$1 lower, lam and mutton practically unchanged. March 21 prices good grade meats: Beef \$16 to \$18; veal \$19 to \$23; lamb \$18 to \$23; mutton \$12 to \$15; light pork loins \$23 to \$28; heavy loins \$19 to \$21.

DAIRY PRODUCTS: Butter markets under severe pressure early in the week and prices declined sharply. Danish butter was the principal factor and competition at New York forced prices down. Other markets felt influence of this depression. Markets seem to be temporarily firmer but increased domestic product and very heavy arrivals from Denmark are to be reckoned with. Closing prices, 92 scores, New York 45 1/2c, Boston 45c. Cheese markets for most Chicago 45 1/2c, Philadelphia 46 1/2c; part dull and inactive. Price advances during past month caused some trade to turn from fresh to held cheese and lowered demand for former. Many distributors have felt that lower prices were in order and have not bought for this reason. Interest now centered in storing eggs and on butter. As soon as it is felt that prices are at bottom, more business expected as distributors stocks light in many states. Plymouth Wisconsin cheese exchange prices show sharp decline most styles averaging 2c lower than a week ago. Trims 21c; daisies 23 1/2c; double daisies 22 1/2c; longhorns and young Americas 24c.
