A simple well table, copies of which may be obtained at the college, will enable one to learn the horse power or the amount of work which may be developed by the stream.

Two types of wheel are used, the turbine wheel, and the overshot wheel. In any attempt to develope power it is desirable to have the power plant as near as possible to the place where the power is to be used. It is always better to study and design the pewer plant in the mid-summer or when the stream is at lowest flow.
