"GO TO FIELD DAYS"

To those who attended the Field Days or Summer Farmer's Week at Cornell, in 1920, no more of an invitation is needed than to say that the date this year is Thursday, Friday and Saturday, June 23rd, 24th and 25th. During this period the college will throw their doors and entire force and fields open to the people of the state for inspection. Last year when the plan was new over 7,000 people attended, and it is expected that the numbers this year will nearly double.

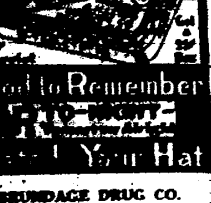
