Rev. D. M. Sutton, Pastor

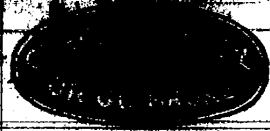

#### Has Had Ten Capitals.

North Carolina has had at least ten capitals including Bath, Edenton, Brunswick, Wilmington, Newberry, Hillsboro, Smithfield, Fayette and Raleigh. The reason for so many lay in the custom prior to 1791 of transferring the seat of government to the place of residence of the governor or the temporary meeting place of the assembly.

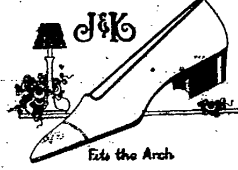
In 1791 one square mile of land was purchased for the foundation of Raleigh as the permanent seat of government. At present the city covers four square miles.

Also known as the "welding" process. Ordinarily, the glass is removed from the window, but in this process the main improvement which a new helmet has over the old masks is the mounting of the window, so that the protective screen can be raised with the left hand of the worker and he can obtain a better view of the work, yet the screen falls back into place when he is ready to go ahead with the welding. This screen or window is made of chemically prepared glass to protect the eyes from ultra-violet rays.

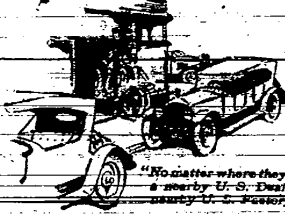
